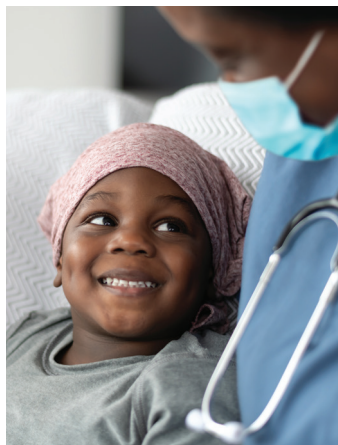


Supporting Future Leaders in Pediatric Cancer

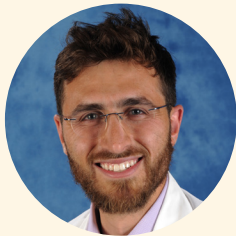
